SAFETY NEWS AND MEETINGS

MAIL AND PACKAGE THEFT

As the holiday season approaches, mail and package theft incidents could increase. The following measures are suggested to deter this activity.

Proactive measures:

- * Use direct deposit whenever possible to eliminate checks in your mailbox.
- * Have your personal checks sent to your bank and pick them up there.
- * Look into the attributes of a locked mailbox on your property.
- * If you are frequently away from home, consider renting a post office box.
- * If you stop your mail while on vacation or away from your residence for an extended period of time, ask a neighbor to pick up any mail that was delivered in error.
- * Outgoing mail- take it to the Post Office or use a regulation postal box, do not leave mail your mailbox for the postal carrier to pick up.
- * If you are expecting a package delivery while you are away from home, ask a neighbor, friend, or relative to take possession of it and hold it for safekeeping. **NOTE:** Inform your neighbors of this action, so they won't call police to report a theft.
- *If possible, have your package sent to a location, other that your residence, where you or a trusted acquaintance can take possession of it.
- *Inquire if the delivery person can leave your home delivery package where it is not highly visible from the street.
- *Don't hesitate to call 911 when you see suspicious persons, vehicles, or behavior.

Thieves are interested in your credit card statements, pre-approved credit card offers, Social Security checks, birthday cards, etc. either for the cash or the information contained within that can be used for Identity Theft.

Police and communities working together as a team can only improve the safety of our neighborhoods. Although we never want any citizen to put themselves in harm's

<u>way</u>, information that residents can provide regarding a crime in progress, suspicious persons/behavior/or vehicles, and, most importantly suspect descriptions, can be extremely helpful in identifying and apprehending suspects.

<u>P.R.I.S.M.</u>
